

Luther becomes VP of E.B. Blount & Sons, innovating a new way of steaming clams that made its way into Campbell's Soups clam chowder.



1949 Luther discovers a calling in shipbuilding during the construction of a new oyster boat for the family business and he establishes Blount Marine Co.

1953 Blount builds Miss Liberty for Circle Line Statue of Liberty Ferry Co.



1964

Word gets around about Luther's family vacations on his private boat. Soon, neighbors and friends of family ask to join summer adventures on The Explorer. A vision to start his own cruise line begins to take shape in his mind.

Luther establishes American Canadian Line.



1976

Blount Marine builds its 200th vessel, the Fire Island Miss.

1979

Nancy joins the family business working under her father as Vice President.



1997

Luther builds his grand class cruise ships, carrying up to 100 passengers.

Luther continues working on his inventions. After exploring the Rio Dulce in a dugout canoe, he develops adventurous new itineraries and builds 2 cruise ships with new innovations.



The Retractable Pilot House

This patented feature allows our vessels to slip beneath low bridges and transit locks that typically exclude cruise ships. As a result of this invention, our ships are the only overnight cruising vessels able to navigate the historic Erie Canal.



The Bow Ramp

Disembark directly from the ship's bow for direct access to the loveliest of beaches and interesting terrain possible.



Glass-Bottom Boat

This unique 21' x 10' craft will allow snorkelers and non-snorkelers alike to view marine life beneath the waves without getting wet! Winters only.



Shallow 6 1/2 ft Draft

Blount's ships can cruise in less than seven feet of water, which means we can enter areas other ships cannot navigate. This avoids crowded ports and tourist traps so that our passengers can see the best an area has to offer.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

HOW DO I MAKE A RESERVATION?

Simply call your preferred travel agent or call our reservations department

WHEN ARE PAYMENTS DUE?

Final payment of balance is due **90 days** prior to date of sailing. A deposit of \$500 per person is due at the time of booking.

WHERE CAN I FIND INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR OPTIONAL EXCURSIONS?

Optional excursions, along with itineraries, and other



cruise information will be emailed 60 days prior to departure date. You may pre-purchase excursions up to 2 weeks before sailing by calling 800-556-7450. Each excursion booked onboard the vessel is subject to a fee.

WHAT IF I ARRIVE LATE?

In the event of flight delays, we will make every reasonable effort to connect you to your ongoing itinerary at your own expense. We strongly encourage early arrival and the purchase of trip insurance to reduce any out of pocket expenses you may incur during unforeseen circumstances.

WHAT IS YOUR EARLY ARRIVAL POLICY?

On most cruises we offer an onboard early arrival package for \$150 per person, including one chef-prepared dinner and breakfast. This allows the guest to arrive one day prior to departure. Boarding is at 5 PM.

CAN YOU BOOK OUR FLIGHTS?

We do not book air reservations. Please check with your Reservation Specialist or Travel Agent for both arrival embarkation and departure disembarkation times.



WHAT'S AVAILABLE FOR SOLO TRAVELERS?

We have select cabins configured as single accommodations and priced for single occupancy. We also offer a "Willing to Share" program that allows you to pay a per person rate for a double occupancy room. You will be waitlisted for a same-gender traveling companion, however should no other person reserve under this program you will be placed alone in that double occupancy cabin. We also have designated double occupancy cabins you may reserve at a supplement rate.

WHAT IS THE COST OF THE PORT CHARGES?

Port charges vary by cruise and include passenger taxes and charges for services imposed by governmental or quasi-governmental entities. They are subject to change without notice.

CAN CHILDREN TRAVEL ON THE CRUISE?

We welcome children who are 14 years or older and accompanied by an adult.



WHAT IS THE ELECTRICAL CURRENT ON THE SHIP?

Only 110-Volt AC appliances may be used. Hair dryers are provided in every cabin. Electric shavers and toothbrushes may be operated without converters. Ironing is strictly forbidden in cabins.

SHOULD I BRING MY VALUABLES ON-BOARD?

When traveling internationally, it is strongly recommended that U.S. residents have their valuables, such as cameras, binoculars, radios, watches, jewelry, etc., registered with U.S. Customs before departure at a Customs Office in their area or at embarkation. There are no safes provided in cabins. We cannot accept responsibility for valuables lost or stolen.

WHAT IS YOUR SMOKING POLICY?

Smoking is allowed on the outside deck only. Smoking will not be permitted on the bow when the vessel is traveling with the pilot house down.

DO I NEED A PASSPORT?

On our international itineraries, all passengers are required to carry valid passports. On domestic cruises, U.S. citizens must have a valid government-issued photo ID. Passport is required for Niagara Falls tour in Buffalo, NY. Naturalized U.S. citizens are advised to carry their naturalization papers. Other non-U.S. citizens



must have passports and all necessary visas. Please be advised that if you have been convicted of a criminal offense, you may not be allowed into certain countries such as Canada. Check with the appropriate consulate for entry requirements for international destinations.

DO I NEED MONEY DURING THE CRUISE?

It is recommended that passengers carry a supply of U.S. currency. Credit cards (MasterCard, VISA, or Discover) may be used onboard the ship for payment of optional excursions, souvenirs, and upgrades.

ARE GRATUITIES INCLUDED?

Gratuities are not included in cruise fare and are at the complete discretion of the passenger at the end of the cruise. The common industry standard is \$14-\$16 per passenger, per day. Credit cards cannot be used for gratuities. Passengers may tip crew using only personal checks or cash.

Be sure to check rates and route coverage with your device carrier.

Due to our size, our vessels are not pet friendly.

ARE THERE ELEVATORS?

Any lawsuit for such any other such claim must be filed within six (6) months after the incident occurs and unless served on BSSA within 120 days after filing. In consideration for the fare paid, BSSA shall not be held vicariously liable for the intentional or negligent acts of any person not employed by BSSA nor for any intentional or negligent acts of BSSA's employees committed while off duty or outside the course of scope of their employment. This contract shall be deemed made in and shall be governed by the laws (except conflict of law rules) of the State of Rhode Island, USA, and all disputes and matters whatsoever arising under, in con-

nection with or incidental to this contract or the trip shall be litigated, in and before a court located in Rhode Island, to the exclusion of the courts of any other county, state or country. Failure to comply with these terms shall completely bar any such suit or claim. Regardless of any contrary term herein, BSSA is entitled to the full benefit of all rights, immunities, conditions to and limitations of liability, defenses, exemptions and exoneration from liability to which a ship owner would be entitled, including but not limited to as set forth in all statutes of the United States of America, as well as restrictions or exemptions from liability, when applicable, under the laws of any foreign nation, which along with all rights hereunder shall automatically inure for the benefit of vessel's owner, vessel's master, officers, crew members, contractors, builders, designers, repairers, stevedores, longshoremen, representatives, agents or servants of BSSA, except as may be inconsistent with statutes of the United States of America. These terms apply to all claims, legal actions, lawsuits, proceedings and litigation of any kind, whether against BSSA "in personam" or vessel "in rem" or otherwise, whether in transit to, awaiting boarding of or onboard the vessel, or on shore or otherwise. In no event shall BSSA be responsible for incidental, indirect, consequential, special or penal damages. BSSA may enforce this contract by any legal means, including but not limited to injunctive relief.

CANCELLATION CHARGES, COSTS & REFUNDS:

All reservations are subject to a minimum \$250 per person cancellation charge. Passengers may cancel subject to the charges listed below. Cancellations must be confirmed in writing by the passenger or travel agent prior to departure to be considered valid.
