

CHARLOTTE AMALIE, ST. THOMAS, VIRGIN ISLANDS

**ENHANCE AND EXTEND YOUR CARIBBEAN VOYAGE** with our optional shore excursions. Here is a sampling of some of our favorites.

**BELIZE CITY, BELIZE: *MAYAN RUINS OF XUNANTUNICH***

Board an air-conditioned coach for a two-hour ride to the famous archeological site of Mayan Xunantunich. Your guide will entertain you with interesting facts as you pass through small villages, each with its own personality. Xunantunich was a major ceremonial center during the Classic Period and is composed of six major plazas, surrounded by more than 25 temples and palaces. The largest temple is El Castillo, which has been excavated and partially restored. This temple is famous for its frieze — a banded stucco decoration that at one time extended around the entire pyramid. The Interpretive Center is at the entrance to the site and is one of the major attractions. Delve into the Mayan world as you visit three plazas and a partially-excavated ball court.

**CARAMBOLA BEACH, ST. KITTS: *BEST OF ST. KITTS: A UNESCO PARTNER TOUR***

Drive by motor coach through the historic capital of Basseterre, and proceed via Bloody River to the 300-year-old Brimstone Hill Fortress, perched on a 40-acre hill 780 feet above sea level. The first cannons were mounted on Brimstone Hill in 1690 as the English and French fought for control of the island in what would be the first of many battles. The fort is a UNESCO World Heritage Site because it is “an outstanding, well-preserved example of 17th- and 18th-century military architecture in a Caribbean context.” Known as the Gibraltar of the West Indies, Brimstone Hill Fortress offers sweeping views of the coastline, countryside, and neighboring islands. Next, visit Romney Manor with its 12-acre botanic garden. Samuel Jefferson, great-grandfather of Thomas Jefferson, was the original owner of the estate. Located on the premises is Caribelle Batik, where skilled artisans create stunning silk prints using traditional batik methods.

**CAP CANA (PUNTA CANA), DOMINICAN REPUBLIC: *FLAVORS OF CAP CANA***

A panoramic drive brings you to some of Punta Cana's most popular places for purchasing locally-made crafts. Enjoy a guided tour of a cigar-making facility, where you can watch skilled cigar-makers undertaking their craft, and even participate in a cigar tasting if you wish. Then, visit the Chocolate Museum to see the cocoa plant and understand the chocolate-making process from bean to bar. Taste different types of chocolate and learn why the Dominican Republic is one of the top producers of organic cocoa beans in the world. Next up is an opportunity to taste some of the finest Dominican rums. Learning about sugar cane production, harvest, production and distillation techniques sheds an entirely different light on one of the world's favorite alcoholic beverages. Coffee-roasting is also an important cultural element of the Dominican Republic. You will taste different types of local coffee before enjoying some free time. Board your bus and head off to La Mona, an oceanfront restaurant located on the paradisiac Juanillo Beach. A welcome beverage and a variety of Dominican snacks offer you a taste of the local gastronomy, while you relax and take in the view of the Caribbean Sea.

**ORANJESTAD, ARUBA: *SAILING & SNORKELING CRUISE***

Join this three-hour sail and snorkel boat cruise for a chance to marvel at the beauty of Aruba's coastline and the riches of its underwater world. Your first stop will be at Boca Cathalina for some great reef snorkeling. As the depth will be around 15 feet, this is the perfect place to learn or refresh your snorkeling skills. The second stop is at the famous Antilla shipwreck. A relic of World War II, the Antilla was scuttled by its own captain to prevent it from being captured by the Dutch Marines. It is lying on its side in 60 feet of water and has been voted one of the world's top ten dive and snorkel sites. The Antilla is the second-largest wreck in the Caribbean — an experience you won't forget.

**TERRE-DE-HAUT, ILES DES SAINTES, GUADELOUPE: *CLEAR KAYAKING***

The advantages of paddling in a transparent kayak will be very clear to you as you explore the aquarium-like waters of Les Saintes. As you paddle, observe the reef ecosystem — home to a large variety of coral and fish. This is a fantastic way to acquaint yourself with Les Saintes Bay, ranked as one of the most beautiful bays in the world.

**ST. THOMAS, U.S VIRGIN ISLANDS: *SHIPWRECK & TURTLE COVE TWO SITE SNORKEL***

Sail to a deserted island aboard a million-dollar catamaran, and enjoy world-class snorkeling at two fabulous locations. On the south coast of St. Thomas, you'll enjoy a leisurely snorkel over an old shipwreck encrusted with vivid coral and teeming with colorful fish. Snorkel again at Turtle Cove, and swim with turtles and rays. A friendly expert crew snorkels with you, pointing out the wondrous sights below. We provide all snorkel equipment, swim vests, noodles, and a staircase to the sea makes access easy. Enjoy Champagne, rum punch and other rum drinks after snorkeling, and water, fruit juice and soda anytime.

**ST. JOHN'S, ANTIGUA: *MONTSERRAT & ANTIGUA BY HELICOPTER***

Enjoy a picturesque helicopter ride over the emerald isle of Montserrat. This British colony hit the headlines when its Soufrière volcano awoke in 1995. Your helicopter soars over the former capital of Plymouth as well as several villages that are now uninhabited and, in some cases, were buried by 40 feet of ash. To give you a feeling of what it is like to be on the ground in the vicinity of the volcano, the helicopter then flies along what was once the empty runway of the deserted Bramble Airport (now covered in ash), and over the east coast of Montserrat before the return flight to Antigua.
