ACADIA NATIONAL PARK & MAINE LOBSTER BAKE

Port: Bar Harbor, Maine

The fabulous Ocean Drive section of Acadia National Park, of Thunder Hole and Cadillac Mountain fame, beckons visitors from all over the world. As you travel this famously scenic byway, you will visit Seal Harbor and Northeast Harbor to see the Victorian cottages. A traditional Maine lobster bake lunch awaits you with a magnificent view over Frenchman Bay.

FARM, FORGE & FIDDLE

Port: Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island

Step back into the 1890's to experience life in what was once the bustling rural community of Orwell Corner. It has been frozen in time and today operates as a living open-air museum, perfectly preserved to reflect life more than 225 years ago. Work with the farmer doing morning chores, join the blacksmith to learn the history of forging, then enjoy a typical farmer's lunch inspired by 19th-century recipes.

GRAND PRÉ, WINES & TIDES: A UNESCO PARTNER TOUR

Port: Halifax, Nova Scotia

Travel through Nova Scotia's picturesque Annapolis Valley, the breadbasket of Nova Scotia, dotted with vibrant pastoral farmlands. En route through this region that is rich in history, nature and agriculture, your experienced guide will tell you about the 40- to 50-foot tides of the Bay of Fundy, the Acadians, the wine industry of Nova Scotia and Nova Scotia's Annapolis Valley farming. Port: Québec City, Québec

A DAY IN THE LIFE OF A LOBSTER FISHERMAN

Port: Saint John, New Brunswick

Set off with a fourth-generation New Brunswick lobster fisherman on this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to experience a day in the life of a lobster fisherman. Captain Craig has spent 35 years trawling the Bay of Fundy for lobster and he'll share his experiences with you as you smell the salt air, feel the ocean breeze on your face, and immerse yourself in this interactive experience.

BRAS D'OR LAKES, HIGHLAND VILLAGE & BADDECK

Port: Sydney, Nova Scotia

This picturesque excursion takes you on a circular tour of the very heart of Cape Breton Island and includes some of the island's most dynamic scenery on the shores of the famous Bras d'Or Lakes. Take a chronological journey through 180 years of Cape Breton's Scottish architecture, hosted by costumed staff trained in conversational Gaelic and local history. You will then go next door and enjoy the breathtaking panorama as you enjoy a three course meal.
