# Why Travel to the Arctic

Adventure and exploration is all about getting out and maximising your experience. The Arctic is mysterious, exciting and memorable and here are some reasons why:



### Landscapes

The Arctic offers some of the most magical landscapes that will surprise you. Experience endless multi-hued horizons, the jaw-dropping tundra, with lightly covered snow and ice and wildflowers in the Summer – simply awe-inspiring. Explore the jagged icebergs, some of the world's largest fjords, glaciers and snowcapped mountains with some of the most magnificent wilderness landscapes our planet offers.



### Geology

The Arctic has an active geological past. Volcanic activity in Bering Land Bridge National Preserve can be traced back as far as 26-28 million years and as recent as 1,000 years ago. Volcanic ash deposits help preserve intact, frozen remnants of Ice Age tundra from the time of the land bridge. These volcanoes have left their mark on the landscape, including the largest maar lakes in the world. This interaction of volcanic activity in a permafrost-dominated landscape is unique to the Arctic.



### **Fjords**

When you reach the region's fjords you will be mesmerised. Sailing through areas of such stunning natural beauty translates into pinch-me moments, with gratitude replacing language at everything witnessed.

Cruising the Arctic's canyon-like waterways reveals sheer cliffs and a wealth of flora and fauna. Whether it's a breaching whale, a rare Arctic seabird, or a range of land mammals peering from the cliffside, it's an ever-shifting landscape filled with surprises.

Svalbard's fjords are breathtaking, not only for their dramatic scenery but because of the plethora of wildlife, thanks to Svalbard's protected status.

To journey to the world's largest fjords, head to Greenland's Scoresbysund. This colossal network of fjords extends 38,000 km<sup>2</sup> (14,700 miles<sup>2</sup>) and reaches depths of 1,450 metres (4,760 feet) in some areas.



### **Arctic Tundras**

Not many people get to visit an Arctic tundra in their lifetime. Tundras feature barren land and are home to flora and fauna robust enough to survive the planet's coldest, harshest climes. Covered in permafrost and snow for most of the year, the treeless plains of the tundra burst to life with wildflowers in the summer months. This draws musk ox, reindeer, Arctic fox and hares, and passing migratory birds, like falcons, snow buntings, and loons.



### Land of the Midnight Sun

During summer, you will experience 24 hours of daylight, known as the "Midnight Sun", and experienced anywhere north of the Arctic Circle. Witness how the sun illuminates the majestic fjords, glaciers and spectacular landscapes, providing opportunities to enjoy the natural beauty of the Arctic, day and night – from wildlife sightings to amazing photography.



### **Explorers**

Follow in the footsteps of some of the most famous explorers in history. Experience well preserved cabins and encampments used by early explorers and hunters in the 20th century, as well as historical sites such as graves of the tragic Franklin expedition in 1845-45 on Beechey Island.

### **Arctic Communities**

The Arctic is home to almost four million people today – Indigenous Peoples, more recent arrivals, hunters and herders living on the land and city dwellers. Roughly 10 percent of the inhabitants are Indigenous and many of their peoples distinct to the Arctic. They continue their traditional activities in the context of an ever-changing world. Yet, as the Arctic environment changes, so do livelihoods, cultures, traditions, languages and identities of Indigenous Peoples and other communities.



## Iconic Wildlife

The Arctic is one of the most diverse and fascinating places where you can explore the raw beauty, and an abundance of wildlife in its natural habitat, ranging from the elusive polar bears to musk oxen, Arctic foxes, reindeer, Arctic hares, orcas, whales and numerous seabird species. As summer unfolds, the landscapes and wildlife begin to come to life and you have the chance to witness these curious creatures in their natural realm.



### Polar Bear

Polar bears spend most of their time on ice floes in the northern Arctic. They're the largest land carnivore in the world. The adult female stands 2 m tall and weighs around 150-300 kg; males stand 2.6 m and weigh up to 700 kg. Their fur is, in fact, translucent, with black skin. Defining characteristics include - incredible swimming abilities, with polar bears swimming around 80 km from land or ice floe.

### **Arctic Foxes**

Arctic foxes (also known as polar fox, white fox or snow fox) are true animals of the far north, living their whole lives above the northern tree line in the Arctic tundra. They have thick, luscious fur, allowing them to survive temperatures up to -50 degrees Celsius. Even the bottoms of their paws have fur and their short legs, muzzles, and rounded ears - reducing the surface area on their bodies to prevent heat loss.

### Reindeer

Reindeer are built for the cold! They have hollow hair that traps air to remain well insulated. Their noses are designed to warm the air they breathe before it reaches their lungs. During winter, the hair on their face grows long down to their mouth, protecting their muzzle while grazing in the snow. When the temperature is extremely cold, reindeer can lower their body temperature in extremities to just above freezing, helping them avoid losing body heat.

### Seals

The Arctic is home to several unique and beautiful seal species: ribbon seals, bearded seals, ringed seals, spotted seals, harp seals, and hooded seals. These species are called ice seals because they spend the bulk of their lives on or near sea ice. Seals are essential members of their ecosystems, both as predators of fish, squid, shellfish, seabirds, and other marine life and as prey for hunters like polar bears, orcas, and sharks.

### Birdlife

Around a dozen bird species can live in the Arctic all year round: the gyrfalcon, raven, ptarmigan (rock, willow & Svalbard species), snowy owl, redpolls (common & hoary), two gulls (Ross's & ivory), three guillemots (common, black, & Brunnich's), and the little auk. Even for these hardiest of species, most will migrate to southern parts of the Arctic during the harshest winter. All other species (about 100 that nest in the Arctic) migrate relatively long distances to escape the Arctic winter.

### Musk Oxen

Historically, musk oxen have been associated with hunting cultures of early mankind. Their meat and hides were used for food, clothing, and shelter, while the horns and bones were carved to make tools and crafts. The long, thick coat makes them look larger than they really are. Male musk oxen - bulls, weigh between 181 - 409 kg, while females - cows, weigh between 259 - 227 kg.

### **Arctic Hares**

The Arctic hare is a species of hare highly adapted to living in the Arctic tundra and other icy biomes. The Arctic hare survives with shortened ears and limbs, a small nose, fat that makes up close to 20 per cent of its body, and a thick coat of fur. They have a number of anatomical, behavioural and physiological adaptations allowing them to survive in an extreme climate successfully.

### Whales

Many whales are not truly residents of the Arctic but visit the Arctic during the summer to forage and take advantage of the highly productive waters. Only the bowhead and beluga whales are year-round residents of the Arctic. However, many other species such as orcas, humpback and sperm whales are commonly found in these waters.

### Orcas

Orcas are highly intelligent and able to coordinate hunting tactics. Female orcas are thought to live to 80 years of age or more. Orcas linger longer in the Arctic Ocean, as sea ice there shrinks. The whales often travel to access varieties of prey, but it's likely there are now more hunting opportunities in the Arctic.

### Walrus

The largest pinniped marine mammal in the Arctic. Its distinctive tusks are used as levers to move its heavy body on land, and as weapons. They are recognised for their large tusks. Male's tusks are usually longer and heavier than females, and males are three to four times larger than females. Walruses are social and haul out in herds of up to thousands of individuals. During the non-breeding season, the groups are sexually segregated, and dominance is based on body and tusk size.

Discover vertiginous cliffs of seabirds, whales and polar bears, and austere ice-shattered landscapes home to resilient Inuit communities. It's an adventure charged with the palpable presence of long-lost souls of expeditions past who forged the Northwest Passage across Arctic Canada.

Enjoy the spectacular backdrop of this natural landscape, taking in the view of ever-changing epic scenery, whether transiting through the narrow squeeze of Bellot Strait or marvelling at the blue-tinted sea ice choking Dundas Harbour.
