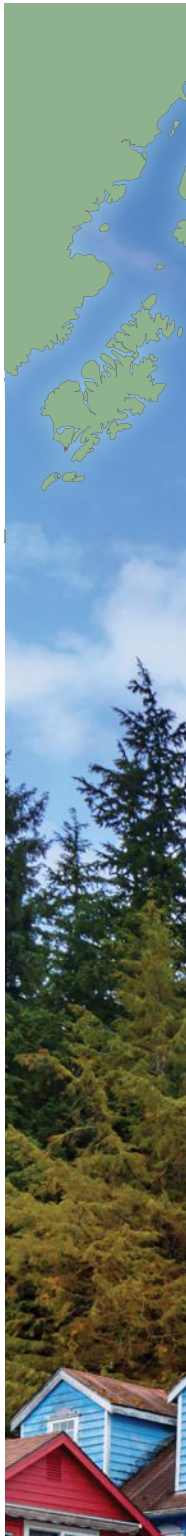

FEATURED PORTS

SITKA, ALASKA

A stroll through the streets and National Historic Park of Sitka is a glimpse into its unique and colorful past. A blend of Tlingit and Russian cultures defines this first capital of Alaska. One of Sitka's most intriguing structures is the St. Michael's Cathedral, built in 1848 to honor a Russian Orthodox bishop. Learn about the fish canning and gold mining that were the initial catalysts for growth, or the construction of an air base during World War II that truly paved the way for Sitka to come into its own.

WRANGELL, ALASKA

One of the thousands of islands of the Alexander Archipelago, Wrangell Island sits at the heart of the Tongass National Forest. The city of Wrangell, a true Alaska frontier town, sits at the northern end of the island, a short distance from the mouth of the mighty Stikine River. The Stikine River, Shakes Glacier, and Anan Creek Bear Observatory are highlights in the region.

ALERT BAY, BRITISH COLUMBIA

This tiny 'Namgis First Nations community on British Columbia's Cormorant Island welcomes you with insights into aboriginal cultures and the world's largest totem pole. Traditional potlatch artifacts are displayed at the U'Mista Cultural Centre.

HAINES, ALASKA

Tucked along the shores of the longest fjord in North America, Haines is an authentic Alaskan experience, an eclectic community and a truly hidden gem. It is home to the largest concentration of bald eagles on earth, and coastal brown bears gorge themselves on spawning salmon in its rivers. Seek out magnificent glacier views across the fjord on a hike along the coast, or take a tour to Skagway and ride aboard the White Pass & Yukon Route Railroad.

KETCHIKAN, ALASKA

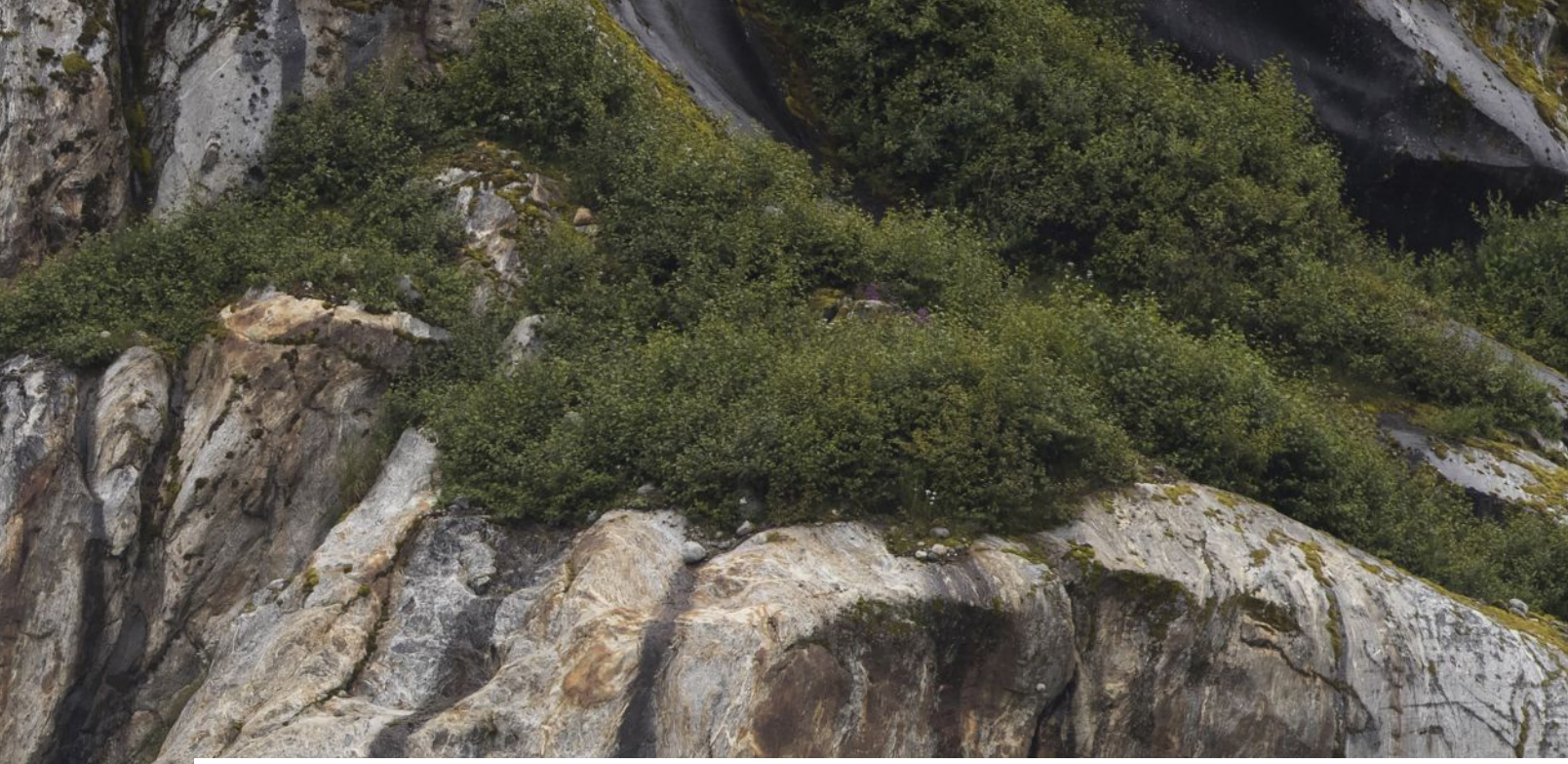
Ketchikan is the salmon capital of the world. The largest collection of traditional Alaska Native totem poles in the world is at Totem Bight State Park, Potlatch Park, Saxman Native Village, and the Totem Heritage Center.







ENDICOTT ARM, ALASKA



HUBBARD GLACIER, ALASKA

Hubbard Glacier is the largest, and one of the most spectacular tidewater glaciers in North America. Its ice cliffs, some 400 ft (121 m) tall, calve icebergs into the fjord, which may frequently be larger than a five-story building. Records show it has been growing in thickness and advancing since 1895.

TRACY ARM/ENDICOTT ARM, ALASKA

A short distance south from Alaska's capital of Juneau, lies the entrance to Tracy Arm-Fords Terror Wilderness. From Holkham Bay, the waterway is bisected into Tracy Arm to the north and Endicott Arm to the south. Each arm terminates at a stunning blue river of ice: North and South Sawyer glaciers in Tracy Arm and Dawes Glacier in Endicott Arm. Brown and black bears, wolves, deer, mountain goats, seals, and many seabirds frequent this vast wilderness region, making it a must-see for nature lovers. Depending on the weather conditions at time of sailing, the ship will visit either Tracy Arm or Endicott Arm.

RUDYERD BAY (MISTY FJORDS), ALASKA

Long before the arrival of Scottish-American naturalist, John Muir, who compared this park with Yosemite Valley, the Tlingit people lived and moved throughout this region, surviving on what the land provided. Evidence of their historic and ongoing presence is recorded in the many pictographs found along the shores of Misty Fjords. Take in the lush scenery in quiet wonder on an optional guided kayak trip or Zodiac® tour.

INIAN ISLANDS, ALASKA

As the gatekeepers to the northern entrance of the fabled Inside Passage, the remote Inian Islands stand between Cross Sound and Icy Strait, exposed to the high energy seas of the Pacific Ocean. Renowned for their abundance of wildlife, Sitka black-tailed deer, and bald eagles frequent their rugged and rocky shores. The current through these narrow island channels brings a rich bounty for wildlife to feed from, attracting sea otters, humpback whales, and Steller sea lions.



ALASKA WILDLIFE

IN THE SEA, THE SKY, AND THE FOREST — EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED

Alaska's prolific wildlife provides frequent but always unpredictable delights to your voyage. Expedition Team members add expert insights on their lives and habits, alert you to sightings, and answer questions.



BROWN BEARS

Brown bears and grizzly bears are the same species with many separate subspecies, including the Kodiak bear. They vary in color but can be identified by the large shoulder hump on their back.



BLACK BEARS

Although the smallest of the bears found in North America, black bears are also the most numerous. Very adaptable and found in many different habitats, they can climb trees with great efficiency.



MOOSE

Alaska's largest deer species are solitary by nature. Females are often seen feeding with young in shallow water. The huge males with their impressive palmate antlers are usually alone.



MOUNTAIN GOATS

The last living remnant of an ancient genus, mountain goats are rarely seen up close. They nimbly roam the snow-swept slopes, and their scarcity only increases the thrill of sighting them.



BALD EAGLES

The national symbol of the United States since 1782, bald eagles can soar high overhead and trust on their great eyesight to see fish a mile below.



HARBOR SEALS

One of the most common marine mammals in the northern hemisphere, harbor seals are small, weighing about 200 pounds, and found in a variety of colors.



SEA OTTERS

Found most often in beds of kelp, the always adorable sea otters often dine on sea urchins, clams, and shellfish. When resting or sleeping, they wrap themselves in kelp to keep from drifting away.



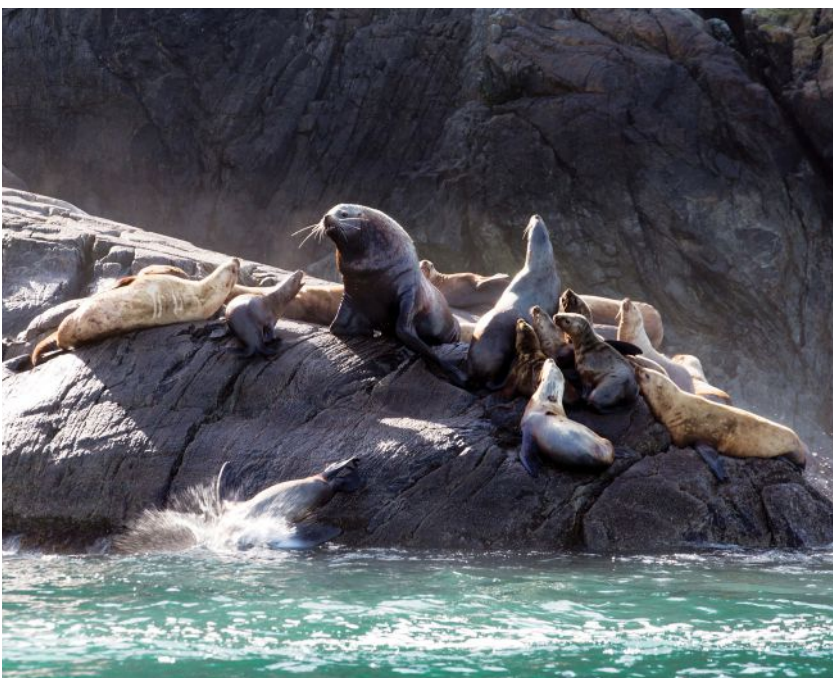
HUMPBACK WHALES

The relatively slow swimming and curious humpback whales were given their name because of the lumpy dorsal fin found on their backs. Humpbacks swim between Alaska and Hawaii each year, one of the longest migration routes of any mammal.



ORCAS

Also known as killer whales, orcas are one of the most widely distributed marine mammals in the world. Orca pods are matriarchal societies and consist of a female and her generational offspring.



STELLER SEA LIONS

Steller sea lions are the largest member of the eared seals, where males may be up to 11 feet long and weigh up to 2,500 pounds.

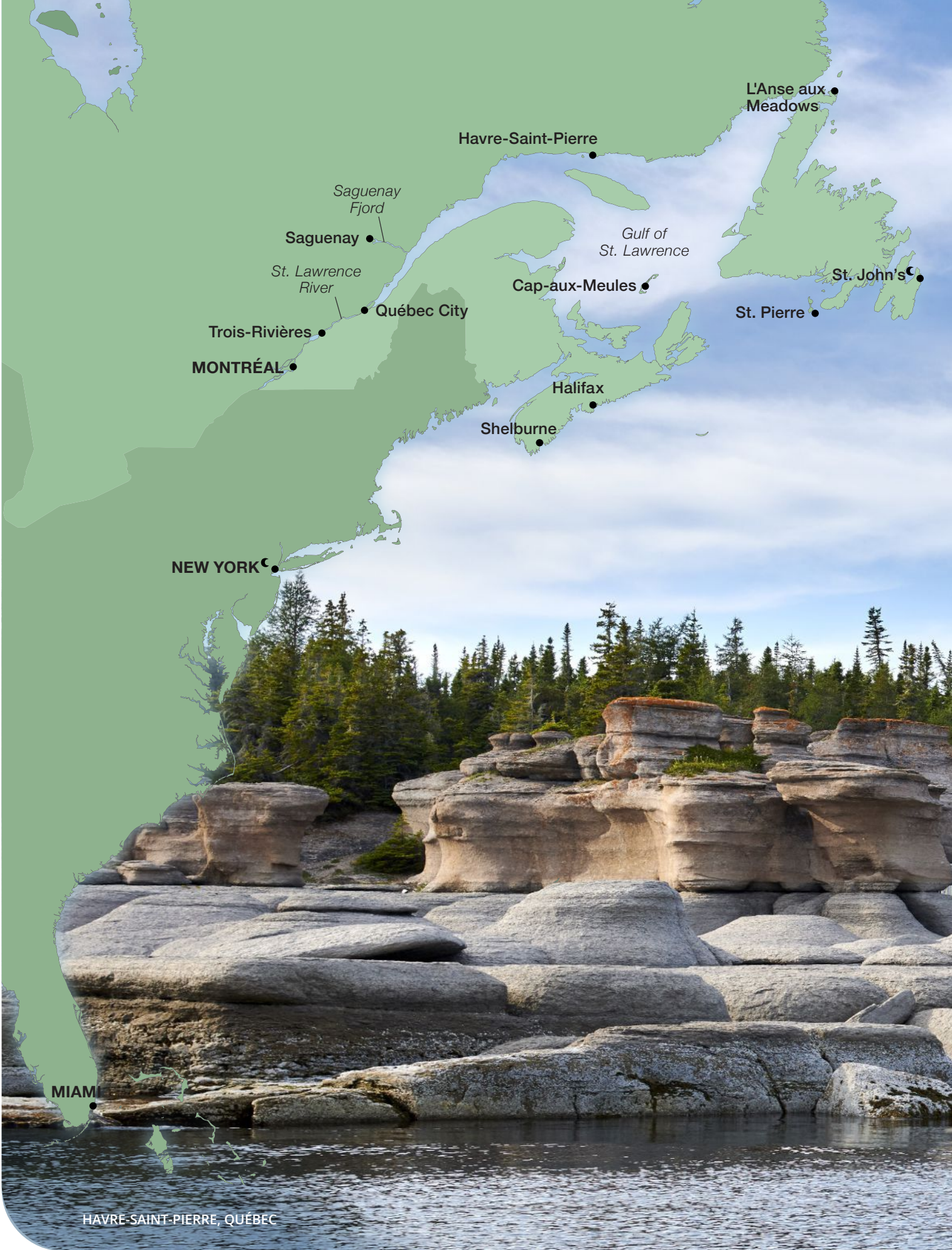

FEATURED PORTS

QUÉBEC CITY, QUÉBEC

Dock near the Petit Champlain quarter, Québec's oldest section. Above you, overlooking the St. Lawrence River, waits Old Québec, Dufferin Terrace, and the Place d'Armes — a combined UNESCO World Heritage Site. Overnight calls on every 12 day itinerary between New York and Montréal ensure you have time to see it all and embrace the abounding sites and culture.

MONTRÉAL, QUÉBEC

A port accessible only by small ship cruising, Montréal is the largest French-speaking city outside Paris. The city, however, enjoys a unique French-Canadian joie de vivre all its own. Whether you prefer to explore the charming streets of the old city, or you prefer Mother Nature, this port offers many charming delights. Arrive early to soak up the ambiance and architecture or stay an extra night after your voyage to soak up the last of the fall foliage. Ascend Mont Royal for a view, or venture into the Laurentian Mountains for stunning autumn scenery.

SAGUENAY, QUÉBEC

It's a joyous occasion when a ship comes into Saguenay, at the head of a spectacular fjord. You'll be treated as an honored guest, and the natural splendors of the Laurentian forests are a favorite playground of the Québécois.

HAVRE-SAINT-PIERRE, QUÉBEC

Townfolk here speak nearly pure Acadian French, and their picturesque church boasts fascinating Innu artworks. The offshore Mingan Archipelago National Park Reserve reveals marine fossils, bizarre monoliths, and colonies of puffins and razorbills.

HALIFAX, NOVA SCOTIA

In the City of Trees, visit the Halifax Citadel and the iconic Town Clock, then head out to the restored and re-enacted 18th-century French Fortress of Louisbourg. Or take the scenic Lighthouse Route to picturesque Peggy's Cove.

CAP-AUX-MEULES, ÎLES DE LA MADELEINE, QUÉBEC

Experience the charm of Îles de la Madeleine, a Canadian gem in the Gulf of St. Lawrence. Explore vibrant sand dunes, visit harbor seal colonies, and enjoy fresh seafood delicacies. Discover the Acadian heritage, tour lighthouses, partake in music festivals, and relish adventurous paragliding. The islands offer a blend of natural beauty and cultural richness.







CHARLOTTETOWN, PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND



BAIE-COMEAU, QUÉBEC

Located on the North Shore of the St. Lawrence River northeast of Québec, this town was born of the forest and river resources and still thrives on them. Timber and paper production built this city, and a fun “lumberjack experience” at the Village Forestier d’Antan Interpretive Center calls to those seeking fun and excitement. Explore the boreal forest, its wildlife and the geology of the Laurentian Plateau in displays and in person.

NEW YORK, NEW YORK

One of the thrills of a lifetime is sailing in or out of New York Harbor alongside the skyline of Manhattan and the Statue of Liberty lifting her torch. This is the Big Apple, one of the world’s great cities.

ST. PIERRE, ST. PIERRE & MIQUELON

St. Pierre & Miquelon is 16 miles from Newfoundland and 2,400 miles from Europe. But the descendants of Basque, Breton, and Norman fishermen here speak metropolitan French; and their customs, food, and personalities are firmly Gallic.

CHARLOTTETOWN, PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND

PEI’s capital is full of buildings recalling a nostalgic ‘Anne of Green Gables’ Victorian past that still informs its present. The City Hall is a National Historic Site of Canada, proclaiming it the Birthplace of Confederation.

TROIS-RIVIÈRES, QUÉBEC

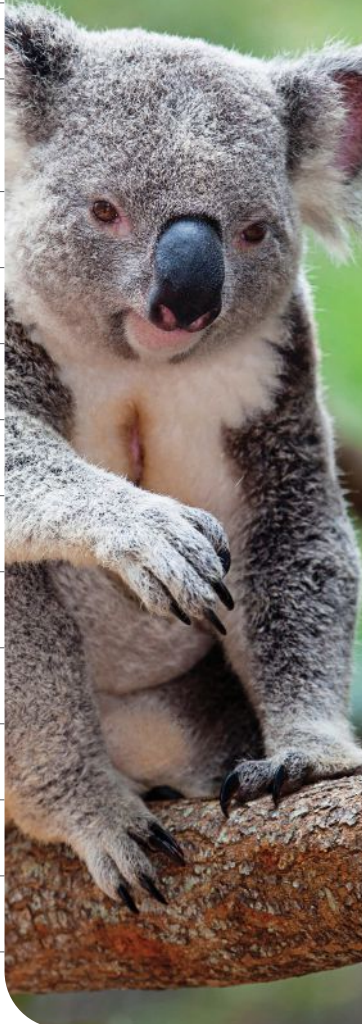
This very early French outpost in Canada preserves many of its historic buildings, including the Ursuline Convent dating from 1697. Tour the Old Prison with a former ‘convict’, or visit the Sanctuary of Notre Dame du Cap.

SHELBURNE, NOVA SCOTIA

Although it was first colonized by French Acadians in the late 17th century, Shelburne’s real expansion began during the American Revolution, when it was a haven for British Loyalists fleeing the mainland colonies. In 1783, these included a large number of escaped African-American slaves who founded Birchtown, at that time the largest free black community in North America. A decade later, some 1,000 of them accepted a British offer to relocate to the new African colony in Freetown, Sierra Leone. Learn about this, as well as Shelburne’s shipbuilding past and other historical eras in the town’s complex of museums.
