

# When To Go

## Spring

### OCTOBER TO NOVEMBER

As the long polar winter draws to a close, spring sun reveals the majestic glaciers and snow-clad peaks of the Antarctic Peninsula, and wildlife begins to return to its shores.

Sea ice lingers in sheltered bays and many of our landing sites are covered in pristine snow. The luminous sunrises and sunsets of spring are magical. Penguins return to their rookeries, build their nests and lay the first eggs of the season. On Zodiac cruises, look out for minke and humpback whales, and crabeater and leopard seals hauled out on ice floes.

**Best time for: Photography, alpine activities, pristine conditions**

## Summer

### DECEMBER TO EARLY FEBRUARY

Midsummer in Antarctica is a time of abundance as the continent is bathed in almost 24-hour daylight. Penguin colonies buzz with new life. Downy chicks take their first exploratory steps and adults waddle up and down the bustling penguin highways, heading to sea and returning with bellies full of food for their chicks. Crabeater seals swim among icebergs, while leopard seals enjoy lazy days waiting for penguin chicks to fatten up, and orca may be seen cruising the straits in search of food.

As the summer progresses, penguin chicks form creches and adults begin their annual moult. Humpback whales converge on their rich southern feeding grounds to rest and refuel after a long migration, and Weddell seals haul out on snowbanks.

**Best time for: Penguin chicks, quantity of wildlife, long days**

## Late Summer

### MID-FEBRUARY TO MARCH

By late summer many adult penguins have returned to the sea, leaving their inquisitive fledglings to fend for themselves as leopard seals patrol the coastline waiting for fattened-up chicks to take their first tentative steps into the sea. On land, brilliant splashes of color adorn the ice as the summer melt reveals colorful snow algae. Whales congregate in increasing numbers before migrating north for winter, elephant seals and fur seals pause for a welcome rest on Antarctic shores. Skuas, terns, and a suite of petrels wheel against a backdrop of spectacular sunsets as the days shorten and winter makes its gradual approach.

**Best time for: Whale numbers and activity, photography**







Large numbers of orca, minke and humpback whales are also commonly seen here, especially at this time of year.


