The Antarctic Peninsula: baptism of ice

Guide and author Lucia Sala Simion grew up surrounded by the history of the great polar explorations. Today, she shares with guests tales of her own expeditions in the footsteps of legendary adventurers.

“The Antarctic Peninsula, the closest point to South America, is the first gateway to the seventh continent. When the Drake Passage is calm, it can be reached quickly, and travel is quicker than elsewhere, between the Bellingshausen and Weddell Seas. It’s an easy trip, ideal for a first discovery of Antarctica. Nature is revealed in all its richness here. Cormorants, emblematic of the region, can be seen at sites such as Paulet Island, while in the Weddell Sea, colonies of Adélie and Gentoo penguins live along the coasts, as do orcas and humpback whales.

But beyond the wildlife, the peninsula is also steeped in history. The old British and American bases at Stonington, the hut of explorer Otto Nordenskjöld on Snow Hill and the cairn erected on Booth Island by the members of

Jean-Baptiste Charcot’s first expedition aboard Le Français bear witness to the great polar epics. I still have vivid memories of one evening in the Ross Sea, when we guides disembarked to try to reach Shackleton’s hut on foot. We had to get round a passage blocked by ice. We walked 6 or 7 km under a low sun, with Mount Erebus in sight: an indescribable sensation.

On board, I share my passion with the guests, not just in lectures, but also in the field: ice hikes, zodiac trips... If they take anything away from their trip, it would be the purity of the landscapes – the snow, the glaciers, the silence, provided they stay away from the penguin colonies –, not forgetting the wonder of discovering a world apart.”

Rare birds of the Antipodes

To the south of **New Zealand**, the Antarctic and subtropical confluences create ideal conditions for endemic and migratory birdlife, of which there are 126 species, including 40 marine species that live there and 8 that breed only in the Subantarctic islands. These include the sooty shearwater, which constructs its nest underground, the tiny rifleman and its 'cousin', the mōhua or yellowhead, as well as the kererū pigeon and the kiwi – symbol of the country –, the kākā parrot and some rare yellow-eyed or little penguins.

Whalebone Arch

Capital of the **Falkland Islands**, Port Stanley is home to a curious monument, namely an arch made of **whale jawbones**. This monument stands at the foot of Christ Church Cathedral, the southernmost Anglican church in the world. The blue whale bone dome was erected in 1933 to celebrate British sovereignty over the archipelago. If you are observant, you can find it in the stained glass windows of the nave, which has watched over this South Atlantic port since 1892.

A world hidden beneath the ice

New Zealand researchers have discovered an ecosystem of tiny creatures nestling several hundred metres beneath the Antarctic, off the Ross ice shelf. These amphipods, which look like microscopic shrimps, inhabit an **ice cathedral** at the heart of a vast underground network of more than 400 lakes, caves and rivers that have existed for hundreds of thousands of years and never been explored.

The 'South American Jack London'

The Chilean writer Francisco Coloane has made **Patagonia** his literary hunting ground and his experiences the breeding ground for his documentary accounts. His encounters with seal hunters, gold miners and smugglers fuelled the adventures he recounted, from *Last Moss*, published in 1941, to the novel *Tierra del Fuego*, adapted for the cinema in 2000. Defending the natives was the life-long battle of this "Passer-by at the end of the world".

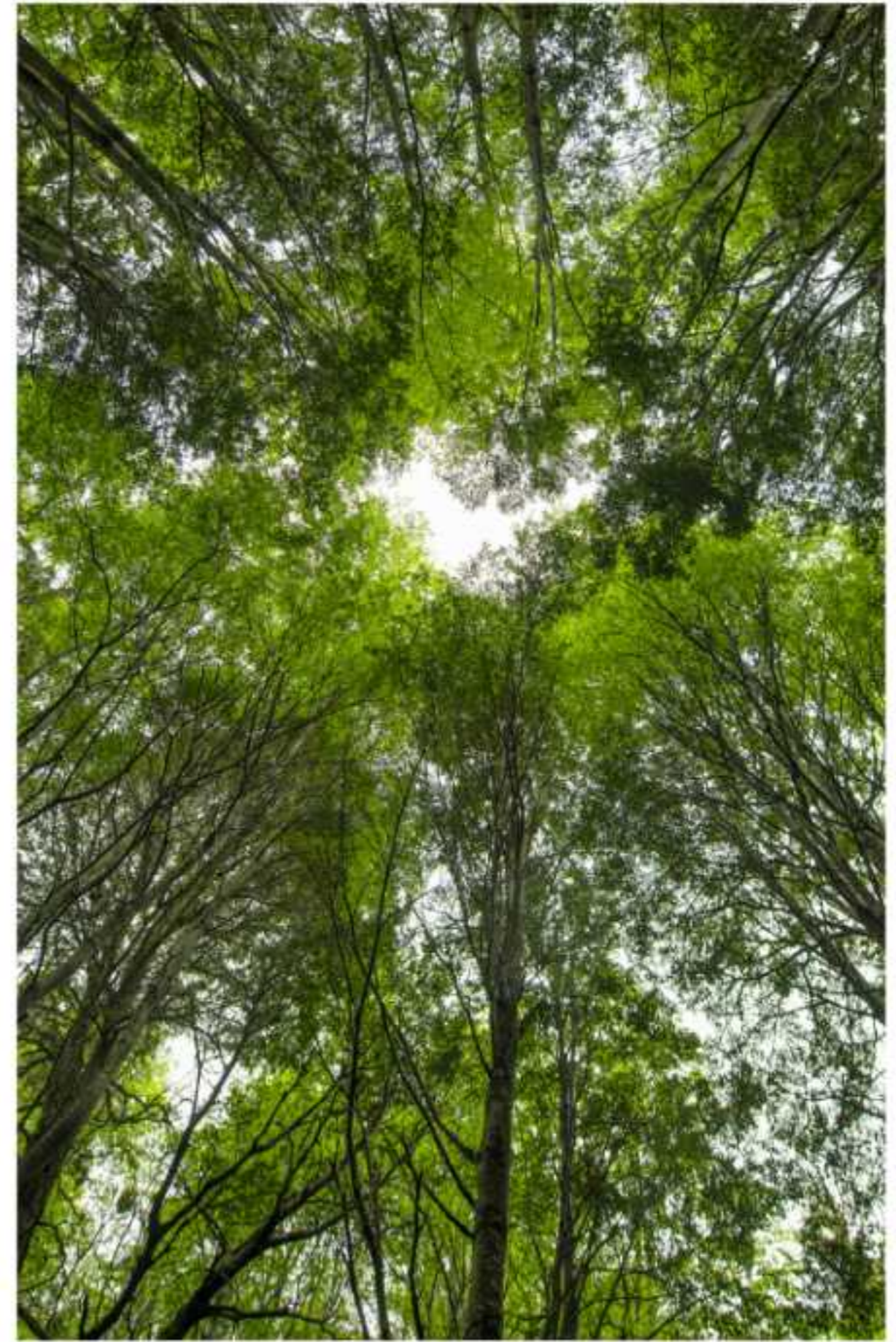

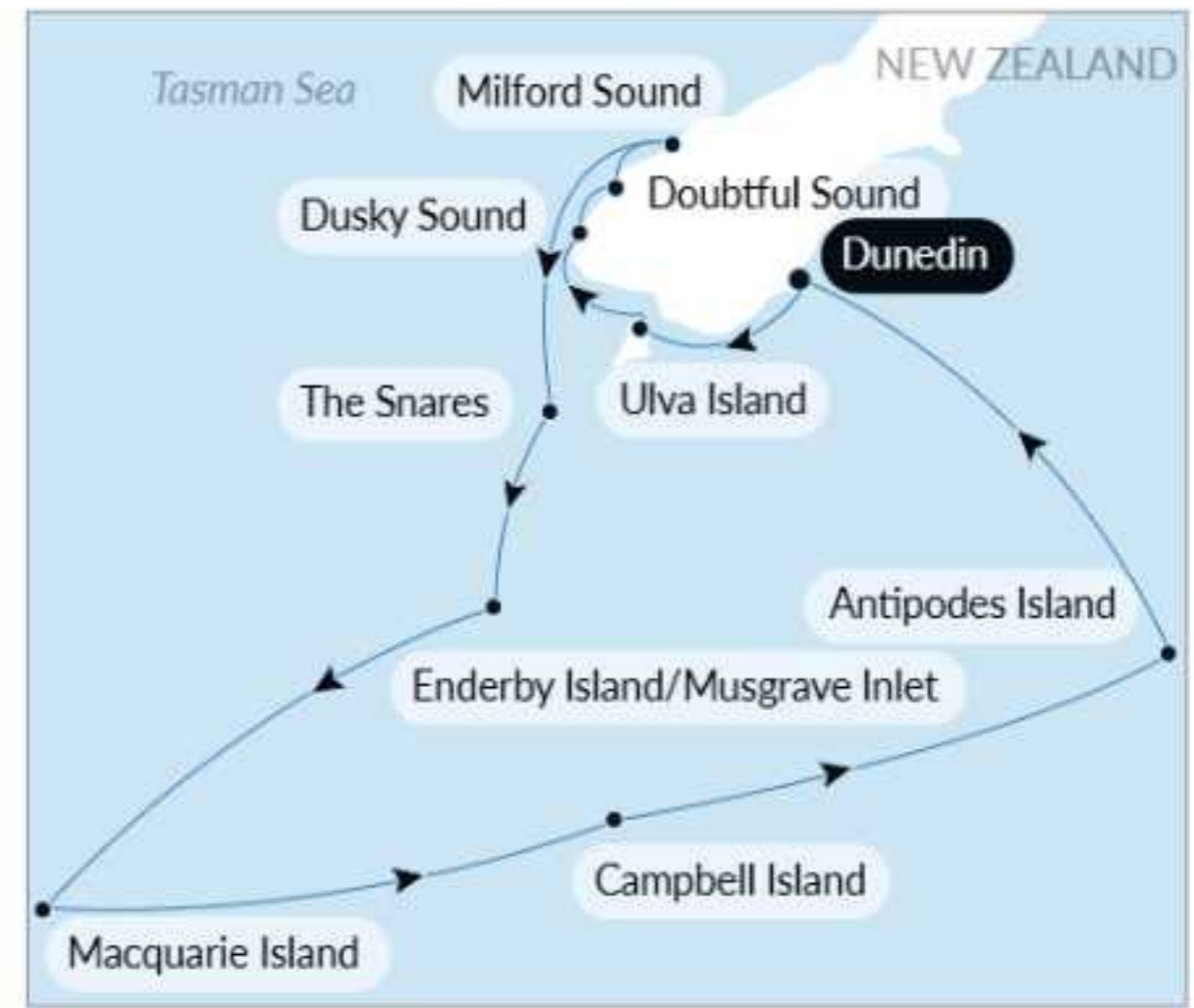

In the heart of a green paradise

A trained geologist and expedition leader at PONANT EXPLORATIONS, Caroline Sanchez accompanies travellers as they discover the unspoilt biodiversity of Costa Rica, a destination that is more than worth the effort required to access some of its treasures.

“Costa Rica offers an immersion in exuberant, close-up and vibrant nature. We go from beaches of black volcanic sand, formed from rocks thousands of years old born of the formation of the Isthmus of Panama, to immense mangroves over 30 metres high, which can only be explored at certain times due to the tide. Many migratory wading birds winter here. In the bay of Golfito, at dawn, sometimes dozens of dolphins accompany the boat. Guests are overwhelmed by the wildlife. Some cry when they hear their first family of howler monkeys or see their first pair of scarlet macaws flying at sunrise or sunset, or perched in their nests, a rare sight. Capuchins, agoutis, crocodiles, sea turtles, as well as blacktip and nurse sharks can also be seen. Each day is meticulously organised according to the tides. The

climate, which gets very hot even in the morning, means that we have to adapt the pace of our outings to take advantage of the best moments of animal activity: early morning or sunset. Once ashore, we venture into national parks, primary dry forests or to sites accessible only by sea, such as Piedras Blancas National Park, where biodiversity remains intact. On the Caribbean coast, there are also ancient forts dating back to the 16th century, such as those at Portobelo and Fort San Lorenzo, built by the Spanish. These sites served as transit points for the wealth plundered from South America before the construction of the Panama Canal. The latter offers an extraordinary journey, with its basaltic massifs and its inland lake, Gatún... Landscapes shaped by nature as much as by human history.”

The fabulous story of Corcovado

Christ the Redeemer was imagined as early as 1859 by a Lazarist priest. The idea was abandoned, then reconsidered in 1922 in bronze and at the top of the Sugarloaf. Work began in 1926 and this concrete and steatite construction was inaugurated in 1932 at the top of the 'hunchbacked' mount (in Portuguese, Corcovado) overlooking the bay of Rio de Janeiro. It is the result of an extraordinary human and artistic journey: Brazilian architect da Silva Costa designed the form, Parisian sculptor Landowski made the model, French engineer Caquot the concrete structure, and Romanian Leonida the monumental head.

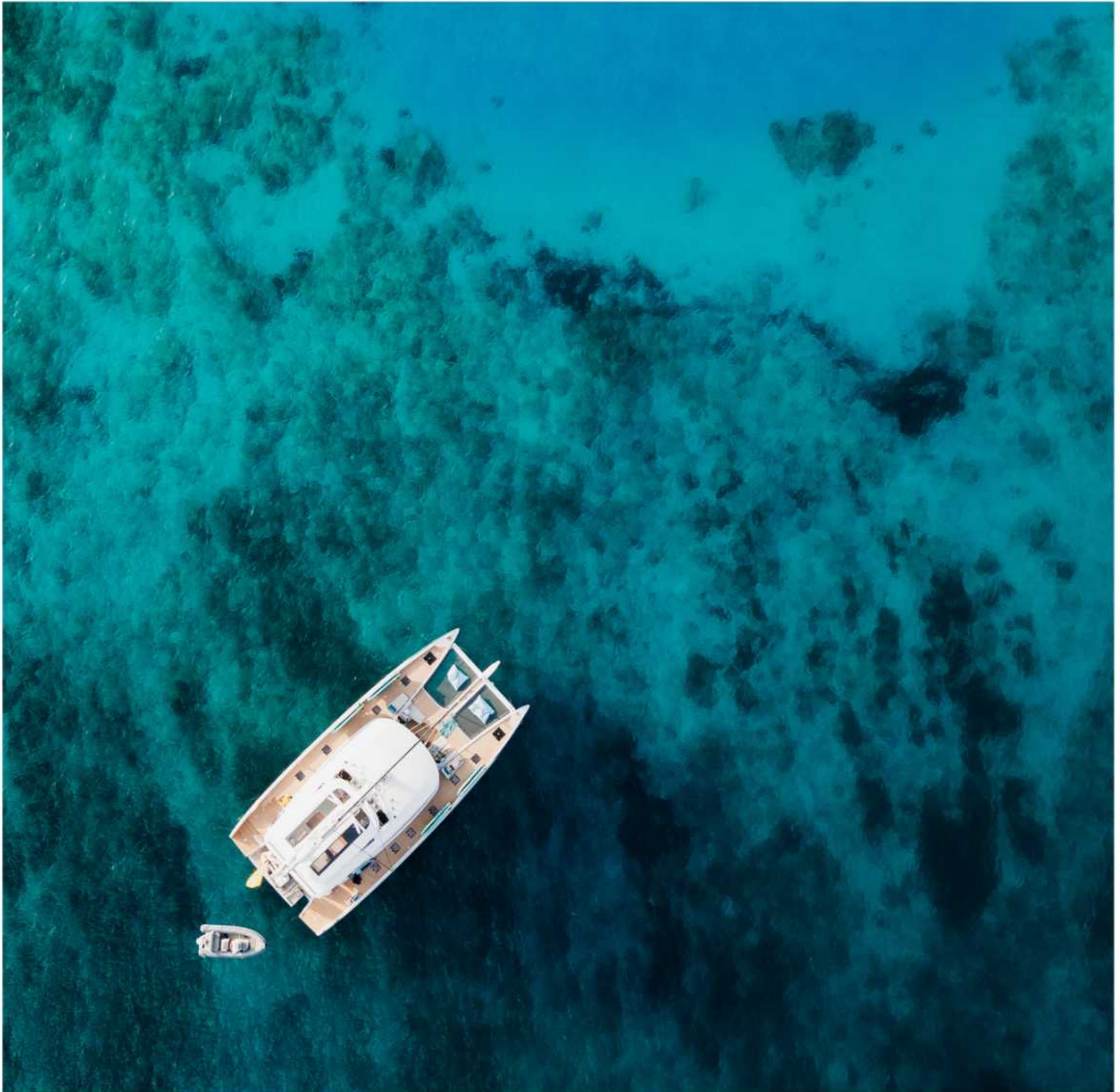

Baltic gold

Baltic amber, otherwise known as succinite, is an infinitely precious stone, hidden at the bottom of the world's youngest sea, yet is simply fossilised resin from the conifers that covered what was just a plain more than 44 million years ago. It is valued because it contains a treasure from the mists of time in the form of insects and tiny Neolithic air bubbles that seem to sparkle like Champagne.

The church village of Gammelstad

At the end of the Gulf of Bothnia, Luleå's 'old town' offers a journey back in time. It is the best-preserved example of **typical medieval towns of northern Scandinavia**.

The 424 wooden houses, huddled near the church, provided overnight accommodation for parishioners who had travelled a long way to attend services but were unable to return home because of weather conditions.

Bjørnøya, Bear Island

Contrary to what its name suggests, Bear Island is actually a **bird sanctuary**. It nestles in the Svalbard archipelago and owes its name to the unexpected encounter between the Arctic mammal and the crew of Willem Barents when the island was discovered in 1596. Nowadays, the *ursus maritimus* may occasionally have a quick sniff around in the northern winter and spring, when carried by drifting ice.

The fishermen's huts of Lofoten

The red wooden houses with white edging (red because it was the cheapest colour at the time) are called **rorbuer** and perch on stilts on the edge of the turbulent waters of the Norwegian Sea, and are part of the archipelago's history. As early as the 12th century, these rustic habitats were home to seasonal workers who came to fish for the *skrei*, the migratory Atlantic cod that has long fed the country. Their picturesque character have converted them into a haven for travellers in search of authenticity.

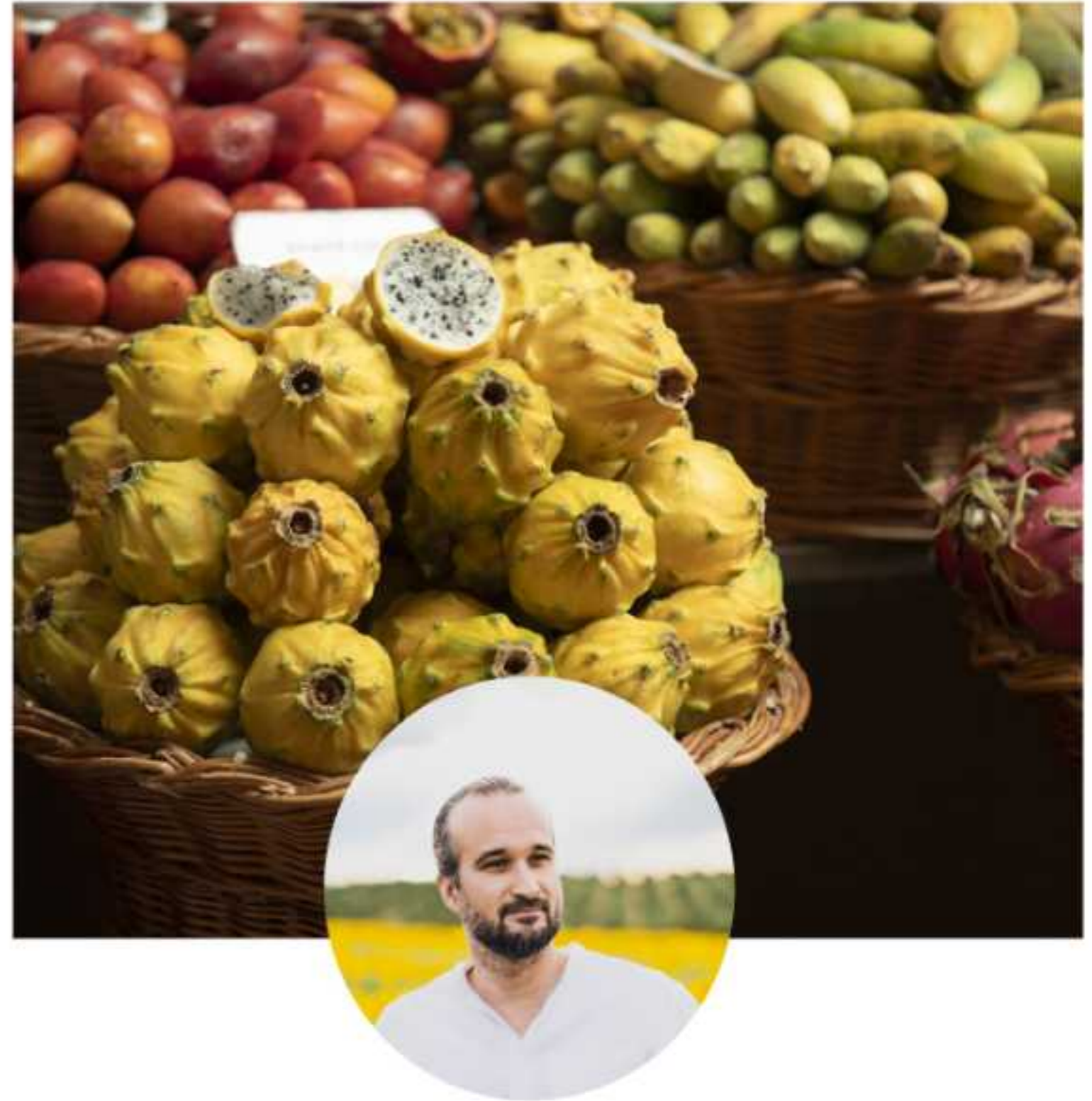

"One of the things that impressed me was the verticality of the landscapes and the contrasts between them, as you regularly move between rock and vegetation. This double facet, both mineral and plant, means you can change ambience radically by simply passing from one hill to another. In La Gomera, you can stroll through valleys and dense forests while, just a stone's throw away, have the sensation of being on the moon, in the middle of the clouds. Setting off with PONANT EXPLORATIONS is an adventure in itself. You can't really plan situations, and there's a kind of constant challenge in creating images from whatever comes along."

"I liken our work to that of a craftsman, and through it we try to convey an atmosphere and emotions to tell the story of something we have experienced. In Cape Verde, we encountered a land of true generosity and human warmth. The country reminded me of Cuba or even Africa. You only have to visit the markets to feel this identity, this fervour. For example, there's a shot I really like in the video we produced, where a couple are having a chat with two young children. We captured this little piece of life in the moment, led by our intuition. Immortalising moments like this is also what makes our job so special."

The strange fruits of Madeira

The combination of volcanic soil and a subtropical climate makes the ‘island of flowers’ an **exotic nursery**. If you like it sweet, you can enjoy prata bananas, cherimoya, passion fruit and tamarillo from the Andes, as well as star fruit, anonna and pitanga (or Surinam cherry); if savoury is your thing, you have the amazing chayote – the yam with a chestnut flavour – and the pepino melon, half cucumber, half melon (but isn’t actually a melon!).

The potters of Safi

Morocco’s capital of ceramics continues a thousand years of know-how. On the hill that is home to the potters, 700 artists shape the ochre clay into tajines, amphoras, bowls and tiles, which once dried are decorated using a donkey hair brush. The motifs are inspired by Arabic and Berber calligraphy. The cobalt blue, yellow, brown and green are then fixed using a traditional oven.

Porto Empedocle Vigàta, the Sicilian clan

Sitting on the south coast of the island, it was originally called Marina di Girgenti, before taking its name in 1863 from the philosopher who was born and lived there five centuries before our era. In 2003, as a tribute to another illustrious citizen – the director and novelist **Andrea Camilleri** – it was given the name Vigàta, the name of the imaginary town where his picturesque hero, Commissario Montalbano, is based.

Much of the English language comes from the **Norse** of the northern conquerors, many words related to the sea and navigation, such as ‘iceberg’, ‘ship’, ‘keel’, ‘hail’, ‘sky’, ‘fjord’ and ‘harpoon’. Also many place name endings come from our Scandinavian settlers too, for example -by (meaning farmstead, village, or settlement), such as Grimsby, Derby and Whitby, among many others.

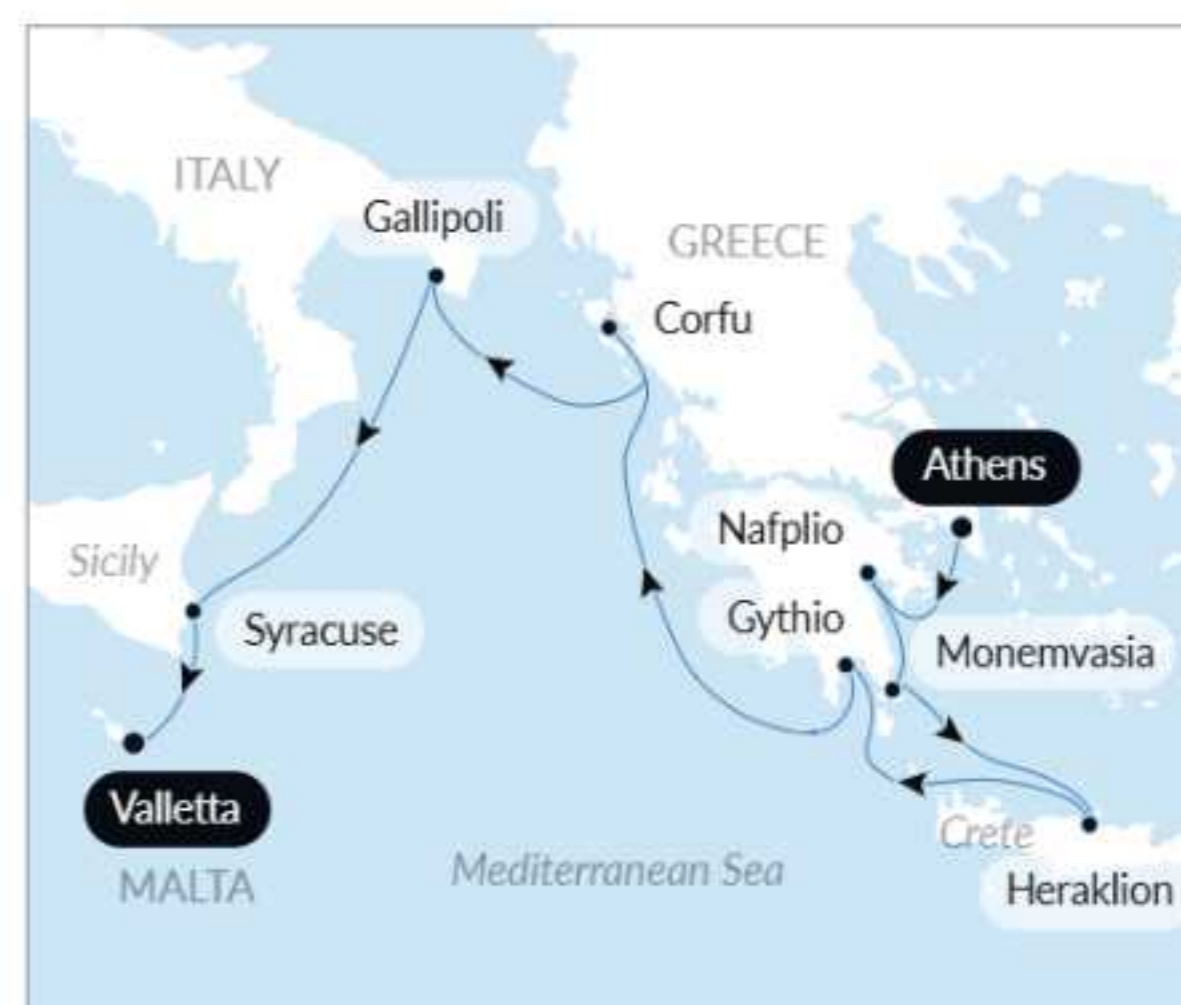

Desert, ocean and memory

Alexandre Faure is a guide and lecturer specialising in Southern Africa. He has accompanied numerous trips to Namibia and South Africa, notably on voyages. He reveals the mysteries, nuances, contradictions and eternal bond forged by untamed nature that unites these two sister countries.

“Arriving in Southern Africa by sea means an encounter with mythical locations such as the Cape of Good Hope and Cape Agulhas, linked to the Portuguese navigators of the 15th century. The history, mosaic of ethnic groups, languages and cultures, deeply marked by colonisation and apartheid, attracts travellers to South Africa, while Namibia seduces them with its unspoilt landscapes. The Namibian coast, known as the Skeleton Coast, is an arid desert protected mainly by national parks and dotted with numerous shipwrecks. The white and orange dunes of the Namib reveal themselves near Walvis Bay and Lüderitz, their colours changing with the waves and the sun. The cold Benguela current supports a large

population of fur seals, as well as colonies of seabirds such as pelicans and flamingos. Further east, South Africa offers vineyards, mountains, a subtropical climate and a rich marine fauna, including sharks and whale sharks. Cape Town, with its Table Mountain, is a must-see. Protected colonies of penguins can be seen on the surrounding white sandy beaches. In the east of the country, in the national parks, the Big FIVE [Africa’s five large mammals: lion, leopard, elephant, rhinoceros and buffalo] roam free. The holy grail? Surprising a desert lion in a dry riverbed: one of those unexpected encounters that make the trip so special and remind us just how intense immersion in these lands always is.”

The *tsingy* of Nosy Hara

These geological wonders are iconic symbols of Madagascar. In the Mozambique Channel, the Nosy Hara archipelago is home to a forest of **karstic rock needles** that are both marine and terrestrial. It's hard to decide which is more impressive: the crazy-shaped pinnacles jutting out of the water or the vertiginous black spires shaped by time and which protect the world's smallest chameleon.

In search of rare birds

With **278 species**, including 14 that are both endemic and extremely rare, the Seychelles are a true paradise for birdwatchers. From bulbuls and warblers to scops owls, magpie-robins (shamas), paradise flycatchers, white terns, cattle egrets, black parrots and sunbirds, the diversity is astonishing – though not especially colourful. Isolated from the rest of the world, the males have never needed bright plumage to attract a mate.

Mangrove botany

The 88 islands of the Bijagos sit in the special setting of a tropical ecosystem, essentially made up of **mangroves with unique roots** known as stilt or prop roots. These hollow roots rise above the surface of the water and allow the tree to breathe, rather like a snorkel. This amphibious forest is a haven of biodiversity, and extracts up to five times more carbon than its terrestrial neighbour.

Raja Ampat: a marine sanctuary in the heart of the Coral Triangle

Dutch guide Thijs Holkers specialises in history and culture, and has been an explorer of the most remote regions for many years, including the Raja Ampat archipelago in Indonesia, where the richness of the seabed is matched only by the splendour of the land.

“Sailing the crystal-clear waters of Raja Ampat means crossing millennia-old reefs in the heart of the Coral Triangle, the world’s largest and one of the best preserved marine reserves, stretching from Papua New Guinea to the islands of Indonesia. A stopover on a secluded beach may allow you to hike to the top of a limestone islet formed from ancient fossilised coral. Guests are often taken aback by their height, which can reach 200 metres, giving the sensation of being lost in the immensity of the ocean.

Underwater, Raja Ampat exhibits exceptional marine biodiversity with small fish, hard and soft corals, all in an explosion of colour. Coral is a fascinating living creature that is home to algae, bacteria and tiny creatures, as well as feeding and protecting fish and purifying the water. It

is at the heart of a rich and fragile ecosystem, where 76% of the world’s coral species are represented. Local guides accompany each outing, explaining the geology, fauna, currents and history of the area, while raising awareness of the need to respect the environment. The 2026 sailing from Darwin takes in the Banda Islands, notable for their Dutch colonisation, where you can go snorkelling over a volcanic site. Later, there is the spectacular stopover at the freshwater Kitikiti Falls that cascade into the ocean. In the Kei Islands, the warm welcome and pride of the locals in sharing their culture creates an immediate bond with guests. This trip offers a perfect balance between days at sea and exploration with a gradual immersion in the wilderness of Raja Ampat, a veritable Valhalla of marine biodiversity.”

The art of Japanese gardens

The aim is to be the first to reach the final post without falling into the mud.

Passport must contain at least two completely clear, blank, unused visa pages for each visa required, not including any amendment pages. Visa pages with stains or ink from other pages in the passport are not usable. Guests who deviate from the scheduled embarkation or disembarkation port should research the foreign entry requirements for the port country.

For more information, please visit www.immigration.govt.nz/new-zealand-visas. While applying for the ETA, you will be asked to pay the mandatory International

Visitor Conservation and Tourism Levy (IVL). Australian passport holders are exempt of the ETA and the IVL.

A copy of the visas or travel authorisations requested to the relevant authorities, or of the vaccination certificates for all destinations where they are compulsory, must be sent to PONANT EXPLORATIONS at the very latest **45 days prior to your voyage date**. We also ask you to keep a copy of these documents with your passport throughout the duration of your trip.

Visitor Conservation and Tourism Levy (IVL). Australian passport holders are exempt of the ETA and the IVL.

(2) **Brazil:** should you need a visa, we strongly recommend you start the necessary application process early.

(3) **Argentina:** visas are not required for US citizens for stays up to 90 days. To travel to Antarctica, it is mandatory to be covered with medical insurance covering hospitalisation, isolation, or sanitary transfer for the duration of travel.

(4) **United States:** should your flight transit via the USA, depending on your nationality, an ESTA or visa may be required. Please contact USA consulate website for details. Please note that if you have travelled or lived in countries such as Cuba (on or after 12 January 2021), Iran, Iraq, Sudan, Yemen, Somalia, Libya, Syria or North Korea, the US Department of Homeland Security can deny your ESTA. In this event, you must apply to an embassy for a category B1/B2 visa to travel to the United States. The visa processing time is several months. If you already have an ESTA (valid for 2 years), we ask you to check its status up until the day of departure on the dedicated website.

(5) **Panama:** the yellow fever vaccination is recommended for the eastern areas of the Panama Canal (Darién and Kuna communities). A tourist visa is required for Australian citizens; it can be obtained upon arrival at the airport (cost: US\$5, subject to change).

(6) **Costa Rica:** when leaving from the International airport, an exit tax of US\$27 must be paid (either by credit card, US\$ or Colones).

(7) **Canada:** entry (or transit) by air: the eTA is required for Australian and British citizens, US citizens are exempt. Other nationalities, please contact Canada consulate website for details: <https://ircc.canada.ca/english/visit/visas.asp>. Depending on the itinerary booked, flights to and from Saint-Pierre-and-Miquelon transit via Canada, so an AVE is compulsory.

(8) **Senegal:** to date, a visa is required before arrival. For guests participating on the pre- and post-voyage program, a blanket visa and airport assistance are included. Please submit your full passport details to PONANT at least 60 days prior to your voyage. These visa requirements may change depending on the outcome of the immigration revisions that are currently being debated.

(9) **Bissagos:** yellow fever vaccination is mandatory; the original vaccination certificate is required. Malaria treatment is strongly recommended: consult your doctor.

(10) **Namibia:** Australian, Canadian, US, UK and German citizens are visa exempt. You will be issued, free of charge, a tourist card of a 90-days validity at the airport.

(11) **Madagascar:** visa issued on board free of charge for stays of less than 15 days. Immunisation against diphtheria-tetanus-polio is recommended. Anti-malaria treatment is highly recommended. Ask your doctor for advice.

(12) **Indonesia:** a visa is required. For entry by sea or for itineraries including exit and re-entry into Indonesian territory: for voyages including a stop in Indonesia mid-voyage, a visa will be issued and charged onboard (€35, subject to change). This visa is valid for 30 days and allows single entry. Important: if the itinerary includes an exit and subsequent re-entry into Indonesia (especially via stopovers in other countries), a multiple-entry visa is mandatory. The visa issued onboard will not be valid in such cases. You must apply for a multiple-entry visa before departure, online via the official website: <https://evisa.imigrasi.go.id/>

A tourist tax of 150,000 IDR (approximately €9.50) must be paid upon each entry into Bali (LoveBali). Tourists arriving in Bali by air will pay the tax at the airport counter. For those joining or disembarking the ship at the Port of Benoa, the port agent will handle all payments directly with the local tourism office upon the ship's arrival.

Due to the Mpox outbreak (classified by the WHO as a public health emergency of international concern), all international travellers entering Indonesia must complete the SATUSEHAT Health Pass to declare their health status and travel history. Each traveller must complete the form online between 72 and 48 hours prior to departure: <https://sshp.kemkes.go.id/>

(13) **Fiji:** some nationalities may require a visa. Please check on <https://www.immigration.gov.fj/travel-options/visit-transit-in-fiji>. You will receive, together with your voyage documents, an 'Arrival in Fiji' letter, which you will need to present upon arrival in Nadi airport.

Australian customs regulations are very strict, especially for the import of food items such as fresh food (even sealed), fruits, eggs, meat, plants, vegetables, seeds, grains. Fur and feathers are also forbidden. (18) **Senegal:** for these voyages, American, Australian and British citizens are visa exempt.

Visas: before departure, you are advised to check that your visa's validity period matches the duration and dates of the stay requested, or you may

encounter some unpleasant consequences if there is any non-compliance with the authorised duration of stay.

Complimentary polar parka: for all voyages marked with the logo 'Parka Gift', a PONANT polar water-resistant parka is offered (adult sizes only; in case of consecutive voyages, only one parka per person).

Complimentary boots hire: boot rental will be offered onboard (for adults only) on expedition voyages where the logo 'Boots on loan' appears.

Stopovers, visited sites, outings and landings will depend on weather conditions, position of ice, winds and the state of the sea. These can force a change of plans at any time. FOR VOYAGES OFFERING SCUBA DIVING

Guests may take part in scuba diving activities, providing certain conditions are respected, in line with the applicable health, scientific and medical conditions in force on the day of the dive. Guests who wish to scuba dive are required to provide the onboard diving monitor with a **valid medical certificate** authorising them to scuba dive, as well as their certification card and their **up-to-date dive log**. Within the context of the health measures relating to COVID, you will also be required to complete a **health declaration**. You will be given this form when you pre-book your dive.

For yachting voyages, the minimum level required for scuba diving is CMAS 1 star or the PADI Open Water Diver (or equivalent). The certification card, the diving log book and a recent medical certificate (less than 12 months) must be presented at the beginning of the voyage to our main

diving instructor.

For expedition voyages, the minimum level required for scuba diving is CMAS 2 stars or the PADI Advanced Open Water Diver (or equivalent). The certification card, the diving log book and a recent medical certificate (less than 12 months) must be presented at the beginning of the voyage to our main diving instructor.

For health reasons due to COVID, we strongly recommend that you come on board with your own **mask and snorkel**. As an exception, you will be able to borrow them in accordance with sanitary conditions.
